



Health, Safety and Environment Management Awareness

WHO IS IT FOR?

The course is primarily for managers or supervisors who may have to manage a range of risks in the workplace.

AIM OF THE COURSE

To provide managers with the necessary awareness to meet their policy and legal responsibilities.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

At the end of the course delegates will be able to:

- Appreciate the main elements and principles of accident prevention techniques
- Undertake accident investigations in their area of responsibility and know how to report internally and externally to the organisation
- Define 'hazard' and 'risk' and describe the legal requirements for risk assessment
- Demonstrate a practical understanding of a quantitative risk assessment technique
- Identify common hazards in the workplace and how to control them

- Describe a hierarchy of control measures
- Prepare and use active monitoring checklists
- Outline the main provisions of the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974 and the Management of Health and Safety at Work Regulations
- Outline relevant health and safety legislation, codes of practice, guidance notes and information sources such as the health and safety executive
- Meet the intent of the organisation's health, safety and environment policy responsibilities
- Appreciate the organisation's approach and the intended health, safety and environment culture

COURSE CONTENT

The course will be interactive and instructor-led, using case study group work, report back and Powerpoint presentations. It will include a multi-choice style assessment.

DURATION

Two day programme.
